

## Chain Sampler Remix with Sarah Tector

*Working with a mix of wire sizes, that you have on hand in your studio, you'll form & solder chain links: oval, modified oval and eyehook. Explore technique and design, gain experience in repetitive production, and build confidence in point and small-joint soldering! Demos will also include handmade clasps.*

On hand supplies needed:

(2-3') of wire for each of the (3) styles of link

(20-16g) round or twist: brass, copper, sterling, gold, or gold filled will work for the oval & modified oval links

(18-14g) round or twist: sterling or gold works best for the eye hook, but you can try brass or copper; gold filled will not for this type of link

(easy, medium or hard) wire or chip solder

liquid flux

steel wool

On hand tools needed along with a torch/soldering set up that includes the basics as well as the following:

3<sup>rd</sup> hand tweezer stand or stationary 3<sup>rd</sup> hand tweezers if possible

(2-3) pairs of tweezers; at least (1) of which needs to be cross locking

basic pliers set: cutters, round nose, chain nose, flat nose

flat file (from a needle file set if you have it)

pickling solution for clean up

solder pick (if possible)
