- Basic printer paper
- Pencils
- Pigma Micron 08 pen (I do not recommend the smaller sizes; the tips will snap off in kid's hands)

- A fill marker (this is a larger black marker, such as a marks-a-lot. Two or three is not a bad idea: they will appear to run out of ink, but need to be recapped and given a rest). Larger tip sharpies will work.
- A white gel-pen marker. These can be had very cheaply on Amazon
