

Frame Weaving with Nicole Bunting

Frame:

Picture frame with glass and backing removed. At least 8x10. Should be sturdy and not able to bend too easily under tension.

OR

Painting stretcher bars in whatever sizes you like. 18"x24" is a great all-around size to weave larger and smaller tapestries. You will buy 4 bars total (1 for each side) and I can go over how to put them together during class if you choose this option.

Stretcher bars can be purchased in the painting section of any craft store (including Plaza) or online. If online I recommend <https://www.dickblick.com/products/blick-standard-stretcher-bars/>

You will also need a heavy-duty staple gun if you choose stretcher bars.

Yarn:

Warp yarn – any color (I usually use Ecru or Ivory) <https://woolery.com/maysville-8-4-cotton-rug-warp-yarn.html> <https://woolery.com/linen-rug-warp-yarn-8-2.html>

Weft yarn – can be the same as warp yarn or different. Should be similar in size. Knitting/ Crochet or novelty yarns are fine. You will want at least 3 colors.

Other:

Tapestry Needle (usually found near knitting and crochet materials at craft stores) Online you can buy from any yarn store i.e. https://woolery.com/search-results/?q=tapestry%20needles&page_num=2 or Amazon.

Fabric scissors or yarn snips

Masking tape

Ruler or tape measure

A comb (yes a hair comb!)/ fork/ or tapestry beater
