If you want to did a bit deeper or have specific needs:

To balance cost and quality - I suggest the Liquitex Basics, Amsterdam Standard, or Plaza brand series and recommend that you purchase 4 oz tubes for all of the following. Be prepared to replenish if needed. It's OK to mix and match colors from various brands. It's also OK to get colors that say, for example, "cadmium red hue". If it's in your budget, you are welcome to go for more expensive paints in the same colors! If you are on a tight budget, please focus on getting the colors with an ! next to them.

Brushes

Paint brush preferences vary a lot from artist to artist. If you already have some paint brushes and would like to learn more about your options before buying more, just bring what you have to the first class, and I can help you choose what else to get!

If you are a beginner and don't know what your options are - buy the two brush kits listed below. These are great to get you started!

Tools

- Palette for mixing colors
 - A simple solution for easy clean up is a pad of <u>"palette paper"</u>.
 - A roll or wax paper is a good budget alternative
 - Please DO NOT BUY a palette like this
- METAL palette knife
- Cup for rinsing brushes
 - Any plastic or glass cup that is about 8 oz or larger
- OPTIONAL: <u>Slow Dry Medium</u>
- OPTIONAL: plastic wrap and a water spray bottle to keep your colors wet longer
- OPTIONAL: Rags or paper towels for wiping off paint and cleaning up
- OPTIONAL: Artbin "Sidekick" box size: 15" x 12" x 7" to help organize supplies

Surfaces

I DO NOT recommend canvas paper or canvas pads as I find they require some more prepwork to use. You can plan on making 2-5 paintings depending on the size of your canvas, how fast you work, and what your class goals are :)
