

Supply List: The Charming Quilted Coat/Jacket

PATTERN FOR THE CLASS—The Elemental Coat by Teresa Coates of Crinkle Dreams.

Materials needed by participants:

Up to 5 yards of muslin (do not WASH!!) to make fitting muslin(s) --this amount would make two muslins.

Pattern adjustments will be done in class.

Fabrics used from precut bundles such as Charm Pack, — preferably quality 100% cotton. Be mindful of the weight of fabric. If choosing a heavier weight fabric for the outer jacket (quilt top), then select a lighter weight cotton like a Kaffe Fassett shot cotton for the inside jacket (quilt backing).

Main fabric—for this class, we are using Charm Packs—3-4 charm packs (42 5” squares each pack)

Suggested fabric lines—charm packs of “Ruby Star Society” (MODA) available in warm or cool color groups.

Or any other fabric line charm packs.

Optional—coordinating solid fabric, if making a Disappearing 9 Patch grid for your garment

Lining fabric-- up to 2 and 5/8 yards—lighter weight 100% such as a Kaffe Fassett shot cotton. This keeps the coat from being too heavy.

Batting--Quilters Dream Bamboo or Wool-- for optimal drape and lighter weight. Smaller sizes or shorter jackets can be done with the 60x60 size batting, larger sizes may need twin size batting, especially if you plan to lengthen your jacket to coat length (below knee or longer).

Supply List:

- Lighter weight Cotton Thread for Piecing (50-60 weight--Aurifil, Gutterman, Mettler, etc.)
- Polyester Thread for quilting (50 weight--SOLID color, not variegated, better quality like Sulky, So Fine by Superior, Madeira Aerofil, etc.)
- Basic Sewing Kit (BSK) consists of the following:
 - Seam Ripper
 - Snippers for cutting thread
 - cutting mat
 - rotary cutter
 - acrylic ruler
 - marking pencil or Dritz chalk pen
 - pin cushion
 - quilting straight pins
 - safety pins (optional for basting)
 - Paper Scissors
 - Seam Allowance gauge (Dritz)

- Washi tape or other method for sewing machine seam guide (3/8, 1/2, or 5/8 depending on the pattern instructions!)

Sewing machine—machine operating in good condition.
quilting seam guide attachment highly recommended for quarter inch seam

- Walking foot-- highly recommended

Class Level:

Intermediate Quilter, knowledge of how to construct a quilt, including making and attaching bias binding
