

Supply list for Collage:

1. **Acrylic Paints** (Basic set with primary colors, black, and white)
2. **Brushes** (Variety of sizes)
3. **Hot Press watercolor paper** -We will be painting on paper. Watercolor paper works well for acrylics. Hot press, which has a smooth surface, works very well with acrylic gouache, but it's really a personal preference.
4. **Drawing board or piece of foam core** (much lighter than a drawing board) that is large enough to hold your largest piece of paper (this gives you a firm surface to work on if you're working on an easel; there are always a few pieces of Masonite in the classroom that can be used for this purpose as well)
5. **A pad of disposable palette paper** (a cheaper option is Reynolds freezer paper; you can tape the paper to a wooden palette or butcher tray palette or to the tables in the classroom)
 - Paper towels and a plastic cup for water (these supplies are often available in the classroom, but it may be more convenient to bring your own)
6. **Scissors** (Precision scissors for detailed cutting)
7. **X-Acto Knife and Cutting Mat** (Self-healing mat recommended)
8. **Acrylic Matte Medium** (For adhering paper to surfaces- Golden Acrylic is a great brand but gold old Elmer's Glue or glue sticks work well, too!)
9. **Paper Towels or Rags** (For cleanup and blotting)
10. **Pencil and Eraser** (For sketching ideas)
11. **Ruler** (For straight edges and measuring)
12. **Paper towels and a plastic cup for water**

Optional: Materials for collage (e.g., hand-painted papers, wallpaper, found paper, fabric, colored paper or construction paper). I will have colored construction paper on hand, but many students prefer to bring in their own collage supplies.
